Modern Foreign Language Requirement (202 level or above)					

- International Studies majors must complete at least 36 hours, with at least 11 courses. Seven of the eleven courses for the major must be taken at Emory or Oxford College. Directed Study are considered Emory courses if taken at Emory.
- At least 24 of the required hours (6 courses) must be taken in Political Science.
- A maximum of four courses (16 hours) may be satisfied with courses taken "away" from Emory or Oxford College.
- The Modern Foreign Language Requirement does not count towards the 11 courses needed to fulfill the major.
- No more than three 100-level courses may be used for the major.
- One elective course can be satisfied by a POLS 496 Internship or a POLS 497 Directed Study.
- Certain courses may satisfy two or more of the above distribution requirements. For example, a course on the political economy of Asia may well apply to both the concentration requirement (Area II) and the geographic area requirement (Area III); or an advanced seminar. However, in no case will this reduce the total number of hours required to complete the major. The extra hours will be made up in elective credit.
- Students wishing to apply AP credit towards the International Studies degree requirements must supply a syllabus of the AP to Director of Undergraduate Studies in Tarbuton 327 for review.
- Courses cross-listed between Political Science and another department or program will count as Political Science courses.
- Courses must be taken for a grade with the exception of Washington Semester & BARD as electives.
